Guest: Bob Woodford, representing the neighborhood located south and west of Bryan Park, between 1st Street and Hillside Drive and over to South Walnut Street. He said that the neighborhood is moving towards organizing a neighborhood association.

Minutes of the March 18, 1998 meeting were approved with correction of the spelling of Pat Aungst's last name.

- 1. Bill Sturbaum reported that the Neighborhood Associations need to select representatives for the City Anti-Graffiti Committee. The Common Council did vote to designate locally the privately owned house near 4th and Dunn as historic, over the objections of the property owner.
- 2. Peter Wright commented that the Shagbark Development proposal should have never been brought to the Plan Commission by department staff if it did not meet the Growth Policies Plan. Fran Moore replied that any petitioner that is turned down by staff has the right to petition the Plan Commission for a public hearing.
- 3. Mark Hood gave the Treasurer's Report. The donated funds will be deposited in a checking account. The bank will need to have signature card filled out. Bill Sturbaum suggested that we have two signatures for each check. Larry Crewell moved, and Sue Meyer seconded that David Walter and Bill Boese be able to sign for the expenditure of funds from the account, as well as the Treasurer.
- 4. Bill Sturbaum stated that we need to form a Program Committee in order to start planning activities and projects for CONA. Suggestions for projects include: a handbook for neighborhoods to form an association, a Web site, sponsor conferences, provide input to utility boards, or suggest the formation of other committees.
- 5. Elizabeth Gallman reported that the City Utilities is considering setting up a fee structure for storm water drainage infrastructure improvements. The fees would be part of the water and sewer bill. Everyone will be affected by this. The fee structure has to be fair to individual property owners and to major users alike.
- Neighborhood Clean-up applications have been sent out by HAND. Bill Boese reported on his recent neighborhood clean-up project. 21 people turned out to help build a new retaining wall.
- Copies of the Bloomington Citizen's Handbook were distributed to the members. Several of the names of neighborhood representatives were incorrect due to recent elections, etc.

8. Mark Hood presented the budget for the next two years. It was moved by Sue Mayer and seconded by Bill Boese to accept the following:

- Eugene Fritz reported that he had attended a meeting with Parks and Recreation for ideas on how to develop the Smaltz Farm. Most of the former farm is located in flood plain.
- 11. Fran Moore reported that there is a small strip of land available for development along Clairizz Drive. She thought that the developer was proposing to divide it into five lots for housing.
