Business Meeting

1. The minutes from the March 19, 2003 meeting were approved.
2. Jim Opiat presented the Treasurer's Report. The report is as of April 14 and indicates a net income of \$2,223.16 and a total of \$14,336.40 in assets.
3. The staff of the City of Bloomington Utilities Department gave a presentation concerning future plans for water supply, wastewater treatment and storm water drainage improvements. Because of growth in demand and the aging of the existing system, over \$30.7 million in improvements must be made to maintain and expand the water supply. Likewise, treatment of wastewater in compliance with EPA requirements will cost over \$40.7 million. Finally, storm water projects to reduce flooding and to repair aging infrastructure will cost over \$25.8 million. These expenditures are scheduled to occur over 5 years, beginning in the year 2002 with completion by 2007. The funds for this work, if approved by the City Council, will be raised through rate increases. The presentation of information on these three initiatives took over an hour with several questions from the Board being answered.
4. Jack Baker passed out copies of the Planning Committee's report.
5. Due to the late hour, reports on the meetings with City Departments and the update on the March 26th board training program were tabled.
6. Vickie Provine gave a quick presentation on the Blooming Neighborhood celebration which is scheduled for May 31. She also noted that neighborhood participation in the July 4 parade would be appreciated.
7. Bill Sturbaum asked that the Board members who had signed up for the meetings on the changes to the zoning ordinance contact him for a schedule.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:00 PM.
