### Minutes of CONA Meeting 7:00 p.m. March 19, 2003 City Hall Building Bloomington, Indiana

#### **Business Meeting**

- 1. The minutes from the February 19, 2003 meeting were approved.
- 2. Jim Opiat presented the Treasurer's Report. The report is as of March 17, and indicates a net income of \$811.98 for the year 2003, with total assets of \$13,240.33 and liabilities of \$3,442.70. As fiscal agent, CONA is holding \$1,590.83 for the Bryan Park Neighborhood Association, \$251.87 for the Waterman Neighborhood Association, and \$1,600.00 for the planning portion of the CAPE grant that CONA recently received.
- 3. Jim Opiat distributed written reports on the initial meetings CONA representatives had with the City of Bloomington Public Works Department, Parks and Recreation, and Utilities. One highlight he noted was news from Utilities that they plan to build a new water treatment plant within the next 3 5 years. A discussion followed about the various options under consideration, such as the site of the new plant and the impact on water rates. The consultants report is available for public inspection at the Utilities Service Center on South Henderson Street, the Monroe County Public Library, and on the Utilities Dept. web site. A representative from the Utilities Dept. is scheduled to attend next month's meeting to discuss the plans.
- 4. Kathie Holland reported on the meeting CONA representatives had with the Students' Rights Department at Indiana University. She said the university is revising the Student Code of Conduct and is seeking input from CONA regarding neighborhood concerns. A discussion followed about some of the chronic problems endemic to neighborhoods adjacent to campus, such as noise, litter, parking, and occasional retaliation when neighbors call in complaints. Kathie said she expects they will be meeting again for further discussion of these issues.
- 5. Shirley Evans reported that neighbors are satisfied with the progress of the Broadview Neighborhood Plan development.
- 6. Fran Moore reported that the Hoosier Acres Neighborhood Association has new officers and that she is now the official representative on the CONA board. She said the association is compiling a directory of residents' names, addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses. She also reported on recent vandalism of mail boxes in the neighborhood and about long-standing problems with developers and builders who do not fulfill city-mandated requirements for new construction projects. A discussion followed about the frustration many neighborhoods have with the inability of the City of Bloomington to enforce these requirements. Craig Harvey cited several examples in his neighborhood.
- 7. Jim Opiat reported that developer Tim Henke has purchased the Young Farm in the Bryan Park neighborhood. He is proposing a plan to construct 29 single-family homes and six apartment buildings with a total of 72 units on what is now an open field between Grimes Lane and Hillside Drive. The Bryan Park Neighborhood Association has extended and Invitation to Mr. Henke to meet with neighbors to discuss his proposal.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
