Program Manager's Report
October 18, 2000

1. Much of my time this first month has been spent familiarizing myself with CONA, its organizational components, and the projected visions and responsibilities. This has involved reading files, learning of past activities and ascertaining what projects and concerns are on-going for the committees.

2. I have been reading and digesting such documents as the by-laws, the funding agreement with the City through HAND, the Strategic Action Plan and the anticipated calendar of accomplishments.

3. The committee of concentration has been the Finance (Fundraising) Committee as some of the requirements of the third quarter resided in that committee. This committee has a third meeting scheduled for October 24 and is working toward a grant proposal to facilitate an extensive website which will greatly enhance the mission of CONA and hopefully cover the expense of such a website.

Much internet searching has been done not only by me but also all members of the Finance committee to achieve the above goal.

4. I attended (along with 5 CONA members) the Regional Neighborhood Association Conference in Louisville. In follow-up to this conference, a workshop is being planned for December 2, one of our third quarter requirements.

5. Membership lists -- I am attempting to put together lists of members of the various committees so they can be notified prior to a meeting of their committees.

6. I have "moved the office" to my home (600 E. Maxwell Lane). This has been somewhat of a slow process and hopefully, within the next week, the computer connections and needed programs will be in place.

7. I am planning on being a part of the Mediation Training scheduled for the weekends of October 28 -29 and November 4 - 5. I believe this is a project put forth by the Advocacy Committee which will fulfill one of our quarterly requirements.
